

#### Board of Directors meeting

May 4, 2025

**Call to Order**: President Cheryl Chipman called the meeting to order at 10:18 am. Present were also Vice President, Adam Lester via phone, Secretary, Kristie Butler, Board members, Pat Kearney, John Healy, Lorena Clark, Bob Butler, Ed Huntley and Ex-Officio, Jennye Hanson. **Report of the President:** Cheryl thanked everyone for attending and foregone a report until the discussions regarding the 2025 Specialty Show.

**Report of the Secretary**: The minutes from the January 18th, 2025 board of director's meeting minutes were read and accepted.

**Report of the Treasurer**: In Sue Ellen's absence, John Healy presented the treasury report with Agility & Fast Cat income. All these funds are necessary to hold our annual Specialty Shows, but they cannot happen without club volunteers. The report was motioned and accepted.

Report of the Committees: The 2025 "Double" Specialty Show: Chair, Cheryl Chipman, reported that the June 2025 Specialty judges were Jocelyn Gagne (a.m.) and Wood Wornall (p.m.) for Friday and Shelly Hennessey (a.m.) and Lori Nelson (p.m.), for Saturday. Sweeps will be on Friday with Christine Kallivrousis judging; and Lori Mowery will be judging Futurity on Saturday; both these are being held in the morning. Entries for each show will be limited to 100 per day, since there will be 2 shows per day, plus sweeps and futurity. There will also be 2 rally and 2 obedience trials each day, too. One rally and one obedience trial will be held in the morning, plus one rally and one obedience trial in the afternoon with entries limited to 40 for rally and 30 for obedience.

The host hotel, The Hampton Inn, Coventry, RI, has undergone a complete renovation. Last year people did not reserve rooms by the deadline and missed out on the group rate, so please be mindful of dates for reservations and be sure to tell Hampton that you are staying with the Eastern English Springer Spaniel Club.

Welcome Dinner will be upstairs at the Wide World of Indoor Sports, North Kingstown, R.I. at 5:30 pm. It will be catered and with a buffet of chicken marsala, roasted vegetable and potatoes, meatballs and peppers with ziti, shrimp and basil pasta, salad, rolls and butter, followed by cake, coffee and tea. **Futurity**: Futurity Chair for the 2025 June Specialty is Jennye Hansen. Nominations for litters whelped from Dec. 1<sup>st</sup> to Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> 2024; go to Jennye, as well as any enrollments for any puppies from those whelping dates. In the future, if anyone is interested in learning the role of Futurity Chair, please contact Jennye. There are 17 nominations for 2025, compared to 16 in 2024. There are 0 enrolled, compared to 15 enrollments last year at this time. We discussed advertising Futurity on the Parent Club Website.

**Raffle**: Members are invited to donate raffle items at any time, throughout the year, for the Specialty Show in June. Donations of all shapes and sizes are appreciated! Reminders will be on Facebook. Please contact Donna Curly, Stephen Giampapa or Jennye Hansen at any time throughout the year.

Rally & Obedience: We have contracts for the rally and obedience judges. Ribbons and prizes are prepared.

**Agility and Fast Cat**: John Healy presented for Sue Ellen the successful results of the agility trials and fast cats at American K9 Country in Amherst, NH. We suggested changing the "day of registration" fees to \$5 higher than early registrations since many people wait to watch the weather. Fast Cat is not always available for the club and the entries from each trial rely on the weather, yet we have set fees regardless of the income.

The same members always step up at agility and fast cat but at 24 trials a year, in NH, we need new volunteers. Please consider trying agility or fast cat with your springer as a new way to get involved in the club, and your pup and club will thank you! Specialty Shows cannot happen without these fundraising events.

Member volunteers who work classes at agility and fast cat trials are provided a free lunch by the club at these shows because they <u>do not take a \$2 payment per class</u>, <u>like non-members do</u>. Affordable lunch options are always considered, especially since the cost of food has increased.

**Grounds Committee:** The grounds committee will assist exhibitors with taping their generator cords down and running them out to generators safely. Cords must be brought in at the end of the day but no generators may be stored inside the building. Personal equipment is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor. There will be signs to remind exhibitors that per contract, we are not allowed to walk dogs through the lobby.

**Cheer**: Thank you to Mimi for her continued care of our members. Please let Mimi know if a member has a celebration, or is in need of some cheer.

**Membership:** Ms. Laurel McKernan and Brian Kirk were voted in for new membership. Adam will be sending their Welcome letters. Congratulations! If anyone needs a paper copy of the membership directory, please contact Adam.

**Trophies:** Thank you to Debbie Barton for volunteering to make phone calls to the membership for donations and placement sponsorships.

Supported Entry: None at this time.

**Unfinished Business**: By-Laws are being revisited to consider whether updates are necessary.

**New Business:** As a club we need more members to volunteer on committees, such as making phone calls for trophy fund, catalog sales, and raffle donations, as well as at agility and fast cat trials. Many clubs make this a requirement of membership. We appreciate the members who have volunteered their time and talents, but more people are needed to avoid burning out the same volunteers all the time. If you definitely cannot work at a show or at a task, the club is always accepting specialty show raffle and trophy donations.

The Show Committee is researching additional venue options for the annual specialty show. We are allowed 8 specialties a year by AKC, so we are looking into affordable options. We look forward to holding double specialties each day at the June Specialty in 2025. We are also considering a fall Cluster in 2025 in West Springfield, MA for an additional specialty. TBD Judges are always being sought for future specialties.

**Next BOD Meeting** is set for a Specialty Show Recap on June 22, 2025.

## **EESSC Futurity -- A Short Course**

#### EESSC Futurity - An Old Tradition

Eastern's Futurity is one of the few – if not the only Futurity held for Springers. It is an old tradition going back to the 1940's. The Futurity was created to showcase a breeder's pride in his/her breeding program. Names of the winner's are printed in the Specialty Show Catalog each year (which is not done for Sweeps).

The Futurity year runs from December 1 to November 30 each year. Litters whelped within that time frame are eligible to enter. Bitches are nominated before whelp for a \$10 fee, or after whelp within 60 days for a \$15 fee. Nomination forms are readily available from the Futurity Chair, printed in the Newsletter and the online club site. Puppies can be enrolled in the Futurity when they reach six months of age. Forms are sent to the breeder at that time and the breeder has 30 days to return the forms with a \$5 fee for each puppy enrolled. If the breeder misses enrolling a puppy that they want to participate they are allowed to make an enrollment of \$50 per puppy up to May 1. Puppies that have been enrolled are then able to be entered in the EESSC Specialty in June — on the entry form is indicated in Futurity class. The puppy must be entered in Regular Classes as well. Nominations are not accepted on the telephone, fax or email. Nominations may be done online through the club website or by US mail.
